## Question Forms: do & is

These question forms are normally used for yes/no answers.

<b>When to use do/does?</b>	<b>When to use is/are?</b>
<i>Do + subject + base verb + object + ?</i>	Change word order to make question
The verb does not change for he/she/it in a do question.	You are taller than me ↕ Are you taller than me?
<b>1. Present Simple</b>	<b>1. Are for comparatives and superlatives</b>
Do you play tennis? Do you play football? Does he ever <u>wake</u> up late?	<i>Is/are + subject + comparative + than + object + ?</i>
<b>2. The verb for a statement is <i>have</i></b> i.e. For possession, relationships and characteristics.	Are you taller than me? Is he the tallest man in the class? Is she thinner than me?
Do I have to go? Do you have English classes on Saturday? Do you have a car? Does Gloria <u>have</u> a boyfriend?	<b>2. Going to</b> <i>Is/are + subject + going to + object + ?</i>
<b>3. With Stative verbs</b> i.e. verbs you can't use in the continuous	Are you going to dinner? Are you going to the football? Is he going to baby-sit?
Do you believe in ghosts? Do you understand the present perfect? Does he <u>need</u> an alarm clock?	<b>3. Present continuous</b> <i>Is/are + subject + verb(ing) + ?</i>
	Are you studying? Are you playing football? Is the baby crying?
